Message from the Principal's Desk

On Sunday 6 November, the Greek community celebrated the 82nd anniversary of the events of the 28th of October 1940, otherwise known as 'OXI Day'. This is Greece's second National Day in the year, the first one being on the 25th of March (Greek Independence Day).

This year was an extra special event due to the inaugural visit to Perth of the Greek Presidential Guard (the 'Evzones'). After a week of various reception events held for the Evzones, the Wreath-laying Ceremony concluded their formal duties in Perth. It was also one of the highlights of their visit.



Present at the Wreath-laying Ceremony in representation of Immaculate Heart College were Mr Nino Raju, Mr George Anastassiadis, and students Charlotte Oakley (Year 4) and her brother Ryan (Year 2). The Board of Directors was represented by Dr Angela Evangelinou-Yiannakis and Mr Peter Hewitt.



Charlotte addressed the audience in Greek, providing an overview of the events of the 28th of October 1940. She spoke and read her lines with clarity and confidence, attracting a hearty applause from the distinguished audience present on the day.

A beautiful wreath was laid on behalf of the school and photos taken, including one with the Premier of Western Australia, the Hon. Mark McGowan.

All present witnessed the historic event of the Greek Presidential Guard, who paraded and later kept vigil at the State War Memorial after the formalities had ended.

Congratulations are extended to Charlotte for her excellent presentation, to Mr Anastassiadis for preparing Charlotte for the day, and to Mr Raju for the beautiful wreath. Thanks are extended to the Oakley family for representing the College on this auspicious and historic occasion.
