## From the Heart

November is the month in the Church's Liturgical Calendar when we pray for our relatives and friends who have passed away. However, the month doesn't begin on a sombre note because the 1st of November is the Feast of All Saints Day. This is the day when we celebrate all the saints who are in Heaven, not just the officially canonised saints. To mark this special feast, IHC has a beautiful tradition of encouraging students to dress in their favourite saint's costume. The focus on praying for the Holy Souls in Purgatory begins on the 2nd of November with a whole School Mass. The Church has always taught the existence of a temporary state of purification for souls who die in a state of grace but still require final purification before entering Heaven (see 1 Corinthians 3: 15).



Week 5 ends with the feast of the Saint of the Broom: Saint Martin de Porres of Peru. He was a lay brother of the Dominican Order who died in 1639 AD but was not canonised until 1962 by Pope John XXIII. Small children have an especially strong affinity with this humble, gentle holy man who became world famous for his miraculous powers. Martin had an amazing connection with animals. He appeared to be able to communicate with them in a manner quite out of the ordinary. For example, Martin had all the dirty jobs in the monastery where he lived; one job was to deal with the rat infestation in the monastery's kitchen. He had spectacular success. Rather than laying traps and poisoned bait, Martin "spoke" to the rats and said that he would feed them in the garden as long as they promised not to go back into the kitchen! His notoriety increased, however, when people realised that Martin, the simple doorkeeper of the monastery, had miraculous powers of healing physical ailments. Such was Martin's love for God, people and animals that he was able to live such an attractive life of holiness that drew people to him. St Martin de Porres, pray for us.

## IHC Pays Tribute to Greece's National Days Dr Angela Evangelinou-Yiannakis

As in previous years, Immaculate Heart College has paid tribute in 2023 to Greece's two National Days: namely, Greek Independence Day (25 March 1821) and OXI Day (28 October 1940). On both occasions, the College was represented by staff, students, and Board members at the commemorative wreath-laying ceremonies at the State War Memorial in Kings Park, and upon the invitation of the Honourable Consul of Greece in WA, Mrs Georgia Karasiotou.



Likewise, at the OXI Day wreathlaying ceremony on Sunday 29 October, the College was represented by staff member, Mr George Anastassiadis, Head Girl, Tahlia Searle and her sister, Rhiannon, and Charlotte Oakley and her brother, Riley. Board members, Mr Peter Hewitt, and Dr Angela Evangelinou-Yiannakis were also present.

On Sunday 26 March, staff members, Mr George Anastassiadis and Mr Nino Raju, accompanied the following students: Head Boy, Mitchell Diano, Head Girl, Tahlia Searle, along with Rhiannon Searle, Charlotte Oakley, and Riley Oakley. Present also was Foundation Principal and Board member, Dr Angela Evangelinou-Yiannakis, who was also representing The West Australian Modern Greek Language Teachers' Association Inc. (WAMGLTA).



On both occasions, Year 5 student, Charlotte Oakley presented items in the Greek language, which she articulated clearly and accurately, and with the confidence of a native speaker of the language! This is a credit to her work ethic as a student of the Greek language and culture, to her teacher, Mr Anastassiadis, and to her school and parents!
