- 1.Senior Girls Wellbeing Retreat: Does Emotional Intelligence (EI/EQ) matter more than IQ? In reality, high IQ is no guarantee of success. How successful we are in life is determined by both emotional intelligence and by IQ, although intellect works best when it's accompanied by high emotional intelligence. Today, standards of intelligence are still commonly applied to cognitive performance. The misconception that IQ alone is the predictor of success still applies today. In reality, IQ contributes to around 20% of the factors that determine life success we all know someone (or perhaps are that person) who has a high IQ yet struggles to do 'well'. So what accounts for the other 80%? Along with factors such as social class and plain old luck, Goleman (1995) argued that life success is influenced more by an individual's ability to engage the five aspects of EI/EQ that we will explore with the students on retreat: Self-regulation, motivation, empathy, social skills and self-awareness. In essence, "If a child can do advanced maths, speak 3 languages or receive top grades, but can't manage their emotions, deal with conflict or handle stress, none of that stuff is really going to matter." (Unknown)
- 2.ACC Cross Country: We wish all our Secondary students and their supporters a great day of sportsmanship and personal bests and know they will represent our college proudly.
- 3. Year 10 and 11 Examinations: As we approach the conclusion of the semester, our students will be preparing for their end-of-unit examinations. I encourage each student to approach these assessments with confidence and diligence, knowing that their efforts will yield fruitful results.
- 4.Schools Re-registration Visit: The college is undergoing re-registration that all independent schools go through at periodic intervals. From the Heart

Weeks 5 and 6 have quite amazing bookends. Week 5 begins with the Feast of Blessed Franz Jagerstatter (1907-1943) and Week 6 ends with the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Both individuals were humble, unassuming and focused totally on the Will of God in their lives. Blessed Franz was an Austrian who lived under Nazism. After Germany had annexed Austria and conscripted Austrians into its army, he paid the ultimate price for refusing to take up arms on the side of Hitler. On the 9th of August 1943, shortly before his execution, Franz wrote "If I must write... with my hands in chains, I find that much better than if my will were in chains. Neither prison nor chains nor sentence of death can rob a man of the Faith and his free will. God gives so much strength that it is possible to bear any suffering...".



When Our Blessed Mother was visited by the Angel Gabriel and told that she would be the Mother of Our Saviour, she did not rest on her laurels when the Angel left her. Our Lady immediately "made haste" to the Hill Country of Judea to visit her cousin Elizabeth who was also "with child", in her 6th month, carrying Jesus' older cousin: Saint John the Baptist. This is the Second "Joyful" Mystery. We can imagine that the trip to the Hill Country of Judea was arduous and perhaps even dangerous, but hardly 'joyful". Yet, in spite of the discomfort, there was joyful anticipation in Mary's heart at the thought of seeing her own Child and the child of her cousin Elizabeth. This is the other-worldy love of the Saints. They always have an eternal perspective that makes them face serenely whatever life throws at them. Such was also the case with Blessed Franz Jaggerstatter, he knew that his unjust execution was his gateway to a much better Life that never ends.
