Message from the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents/Carers

And the countdown is on ... with only two more weeks of school, we are busier than ever. With so many new enrolments coming in thick and fast, we have had to make some late decisions to fully accommodate all our new students and staff. This has meant a re-structuring of class locations and our building plans for next year.



From the Heart

As we wind our way towards the end of the school year, the Church presents us with the Solemnity of Christ the Universal King. This celebration occurs on the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year before Advent begins. It is a time for us all to take stock of our relationship with Jesus, our King. This solemnity was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in his encyclical letter Quas Primas. In the letter, the pope stated that simply writing a letter about Jesus being our King would not have any real lasting benefit; much better, he stated, to establish a yearly Mass that celebrates this special title of Our Lord. It is very easy for us all to forget Jesus in the busy lives that we lead but to regard Him as our King helps to keep in the forefront of our minds that He is not solely in Heaven, He is present to us here on Earth too.



The Church teaches that Jesus is present in several ways at Mass: where two or three believers are gathered in His name He is also present (Matt 18: 20); He is present in the person of the priest when he is doing what Jesus did at the Last Supper (changing bread and wine into His Body and Blood), He is present in the Word of God found in Sacred Scripture, and finally, His most excellent presence is found in His Real Presence in the Eucharist. Contemplating this indicates just how accessible Jesus is as our King whenever we open our hearts to Him. When Jesus was arrested and was standing before Pontius Pilate, He stated that He had a kingdom that was not of this world (John 18: 36). Our job, whenever we pray the Our Father, is to ask God to establish His kingdom on Earth: "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (Matt 6: 10).

WAMGLTA Speak Greek in June Event 2023

Every year, the West Australian Modern Greek Language Teachers' Association Inc. (WAMGLTA) offers students of the Modern Greek language and culture the opportunity to speak in Greek on a given topic through the WAMGLTA Speak Greek in June (SGJ) Event.

This year, the topic was "Respect for people, property, and place – what does this mean to you?". Students were invited to speak for up to 3 minutes whilst being filmed. They could do this alone, in pairs, or in small groups of no more than 4 participants.

The purpose of the WAMGLTA SGJ Event is to encourage students to speak freely in the Greek language, and without inhibitions and the fear or making mistakes, whilst simultaneously enjoying the process. The video recordings are then viewed by the Executive Committee members, who decide on the prizes to be given to all the participants as it is no longer a competition.

In 2023, the participating students were from 3 educational providers:

- St. Andrew's Grammar (16 participants)
- The Greek Language and Culture Institute of Evangelismos (15 participants)
- Immaculate Heart College (5 participants)



I had the pleasure of presenting a Certificate of Participation in a display folder, a \$15 Officeworks gift voucher, and some sweet treats to each of the 36 participants.
